Last Friday, year 3 all visited the Camden Arts Centre to continue their series of workshops on sculpture. This time we worked in the ceramics studio



producing our own pieces of abstract sculpture from one rectangle of clay. The children were truly inspired after looking at the works of a number of sculptors and were really excited to get going. Away from the blazing sunshine, there was a real feeling of calm as they worked



and we were really delighted with the results. Our works will now be fired in







the kiln before we go back in July to decorate them and look at how we can exhibit them in the gardens at the centre. We had a lovely picnic in those gardens before returning to school.



Year 2 visit The Ocotber Gallery

Year 2 enjoyed an exhibition by Aubrey Williams at the October Gallery. Aubrey is a Guyanese artist known for his large oil paintings and elements of abstract expressionism. Inspired by his work, children created some beautiful compositions using different techniques. Some of our work will be displayed at the gallery during the summer holiday, we will keep you updated closer to the time.

Parent Cooking Course

We are now halfway through our cooking course- time has certainly flown by!

This week the ladies mastered how to make homemade sushi rolls and flapjacks. Not everyone is a fan of sushi because of the raw fish but we looked at how versatile sushi can really be and how it can be adjusted to individual taste.

We explored healthier alternatives by using honey and dates in the flapjacks instead of sugar and chocolate chips. These were delicious!



I wasn't sure if I should come this week after hearing we're going to be making sushi but I'm so glad I did because I can literally use any filling to suit my family's taste.

I'm shocked at how easy and quick they were to make- great to have in picnics or even parties as finger foods.









EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Reception

This week the children in Reception began their final theme of the year—exploring structures. They began by looking at a range of different buildings. They explored the materials that buildings and structures are made from and talked about some of the famous structures that are around London—for example the London Eye and Big Ben.

The children then learnt that many structures are inspired by nature. They looked at a range of animal structures like beehives which have tessellating hexagonal

shapes, birds nests which are made by interweaving a range of twigs and leaves, and rabbit warrens which are multiple tunnels connected underground. The children

then listened to the story of the 'Tiny Miracle Bee' and had a go at making their own structures.

EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Nursery

Having explored a range of continents and the animals that live there, the children moved on to learning about zoos. As half of the class had already visited London Zoo, they were able to share their experiences with their classmates. The children then listened to the story 'Dear Zoo.' They looked at the animals in the text and used the vocabulary that they have been learning to describe their features. They then had a go at seeing how much of their learning from the last few weeks they could still remember by matching animals to their habitats.









Also this week the children have been learning about the concept of

estimation—making a sensible guess. They looked at a range of groups and then tried to estimate the amounts. They talked about when making an estimation is appropriate and when it is not. For example you would not estimate which is heavier if comparing a rock and a feather.
