Year 3's exciting learning

The Place

They will now apply that knowledge when sorting and testing rocks and when investigating how fossils are formed.

Shield making


For the Year 1 topic 'castles' the children made their own shields and split pin knights.

In Year 1 for RE the children learn about the importance of 'Angels,' who are they? why are they important? what is so special about them? Ask your child these questions and see what they say.






EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Nursery

EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Reception

The children in Reception have been learning about traditional tales. Over the last few weeks, they have learnt about Goldilocks and the Three Bears and the Three Little Pigs. This week, the children moved on to learning about the Three Billy Goats Gruff. After listening to the story, the children began to learn a condensed version off by heart, using a story map and actions to help them. Through learning a range of traditional tales, the children are able to internalise story telling language such as 'once upon a time', which then helps them when they are telling or writing their own stories.

As part of their mathematical development the children have been learning about one-to-one correspondence and ensuring that they are counting a number of objects accurately. They have also been learning about the mathematical term 'equal.' During their guided sessions with the teacher, the children played a game involving a dice and counters. This helped the children to recognise amounts and then move their counters the correct amount of spaces. This also supported the children with developing
